MiND TV Presents Premiere of *Philadelphia Stories Six* on Dec. 6th at 9PM

PHILADELPHIA (November 26, 2008) – Brace yourselves for *Philadelphia Stories Six*! Our sixth season promises to be better than ever. This year, *Philadelphia Stories* features 42 innovative films and documentaries by some of the most talented film and video producers in the Philadelphia region. Twenty-two filmmakers, including award-winning documentary makers Eugene Martin, Frances McElroy, Ann Tegnell and Michael Dennis; narrative filmmakers Rocco V. Iacovone and Ajay Bhai, will premiere their brand new works. Another 19 programs; will be broadcast for the first time ever on television. These include the acclaimed short documentary *Prayer for Delivery*, by Rich Power Hoffman; Lu Wang's *A Philadelphia Story* and Samuel Nalband's *Charlie & Guy*.

The premiere broadcast is scheduled December 6th, 2008 at 9pm with a repeat broadcast on 12/7/08 at 1pm. Then, the season kicks into high gear every Thursday at 10pm with repeats Saturdays at 9pm & Sundays at 1pm.

About Philadelphia Stories

In 1999, WYBE-TV 35 (MiND TV) received a generous grant from the Philadelphia Foundation to create a television series called *Philadelphia stories*, to feature works by the region's independent film and video makers. The idea was to provide some funding for **new projects; projects that required finishing funds,** and the third category: **finished projects (acquisitions)** that would have their Philadelphia premiere broadcast. Throughout the last six seasons *Philadelphia Stories* has supported the work of emerging artists such as, Kimi Takesue, Nadine Patterson, Sarah Haskey, as well as that of more established artists, like Louis Massiah, Robert Mugge and Michael O'Reilly. It has featured outstanding student films and videos from areas colleges and universities, including collaborative projects by members of media arts organizations and others like Big Picture Alliance, Termite TV Collective, and Scribe Video Center. Many *Philadelphia Stories* funded projects have had lives beyond the series, and have gained new fans and awards at festivals across the country and abroad.
